The taskforce discussed that next year's event should include a follow-up activity for the students that attend the expo. In addition for next year's event, we may want to invite math students instead of focusing solely on tech ed students. Schools that participate in the Get Real Math Premiere would have the opportunity to have their math students attend the expo. The taskforce feels it would be very beneficial to have as many educators attend the expo as possible.

Oran asked how we can address the issue that 25% of students really don't know what they want to do after high school. Engaging these students early in their high school career as freshman or sophomores will help them not be one of the 25% not knowing what is next. More work developing this concept will be done at future meetings.
