PROJECT BASED CHALLENGES

Suggestions for project based challenges for an individual school or a group of middle/high schools were discussed. A group of schools could host a regional competition.

- The challenge could be a small assembly project that incorporates a company video(s). Depending on the end product, it could be donated to charity.
- Ask companies what nagging problem they have that a middle or high school student could possibly solve.
- Host a competition that offers three different challenges, with the school choosing their preferred challenge.
- Steve Meyer also suggested using a Shark Tank format. The project could be something produced or improved. A theme could be *How to Promote Northeast Wisconsin to a Kid*.
- Pitch to CTE departments as a whole. Student organizations could participate, involving various entities.
- Mark Weber suggested incorporating employability skills into any of the challenges. Choose a *most employable* winner. Mark shared a rubric for core abilities that was used by EMT International.
- Host a competition in fall, as part of the Manufacturing First Conference, as a number of similar events are already happening in spring. A 60-minute activity that goes from challenge to presenting an idea could be used.
- Chris Lipski discussed the LAUNCH program that connects Elmbrook Schools' students with Milwaukee Tool and their innovative technology. It would be easier to get buy-in by replicating an existing program. Chris will send Ann contact information for their LAUNCH program.
- Andy Preissner shared that reps from Heartland Label Printers (HLP) have been collaborating with Little Chute
 Schools to create some form of an artwork competition. Students would go to HLP to manufacture their product.

Members of the K-12 Task Force are asked to consult with their organization's colleagues for a couple of project suggestions. The competition pilot will be targeted for October 25 at the Manufacturing First Conference.

12TH ANNUAL EXCELLENCE IN MFG./K-12 PARTNERSHIPS AWARDS

The dinner will be held on October 24, 2023 at the Resch Expo. Nominations began May 2. So far, 14 nominations have been submitted. **The deadline to NOMINATE** is **June 9.** K-12 Task Force members will vote on the nominations at their 7/21/2023 meeting. Last year's electronic program was reviewed for changes. Steve Meyer suggested including a 30-second video, narrated by Ann or the BOD's president, that discusses NEWMA's mission. - Company reps will talk about their products/services. Each company will share a fun fact about their organization. (33 minutes)
- Each company will have a 3 minute video packaged for their social media.
