FUTURE ALL STAR YA AWARDS

To date, there have been 18 nominations for the new YA student recognition program. 4-5 K-12 Task Force volunteers are needed to vote by next Friday for the YA award recipients. However, if they nominated a student, they will not have the option to vote. There will be two award categories, with two winners for each category receiving a \$1,000 college scholarship. The two YA award winners and their employers will be invited to a roundtable discussion. These two winners will be announced on May 1, 2024.

The second award, given at the 10/29 Excellence Awards, will be for two students that completed a YA program as 11th graders and are working for their company as a senior in high school. Nominations for the fall award will not begin until late August.

2024 EXCELLENCE AWARDS

Excellence Awards nominations will begin May 2, with the deadline June 7, 2024. Task Force members will vote for the Excellence Awards and determine the winners at a July 19 meeting. Manufacturers will vote for the education awards, while educators will vote for the manufacturer awards. WEDC is again sponsoring \$7,000 for the business awards and the two new YA awards. Bill Jartz has agreed to again serve as the event's emcee on 10/29.
